#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

- The purpose of this report if for Council to consider Feast Festival's request (Attachment 1) to fly the rainbow flag for the month of November to recognise 'Pridevember'. Council may also wish to consider coordinating a community event to take place upon raising the flag on Monday 1 November 2023 and/or order marketing material to display at the Mallala Principal Office and Two Wells Service Centre.
- 'Pridevember' is a month-long celebration of inclusivity and diversity in South Australia.
   Participating councils will be added to the Feast Festival 'roll call' in the 2023 Feast Program Guide.
- Council first resolved to fly the rainbow flag in 2015 and has supported the initiative each year since that time.
- It is for Council to consider and determine whether it wishes to again fly the rainbow flag in 2023 (if so, it is recommended that the flag be flown at East Reserve, Mallala during business hours) and whether it wishes to participate in either of the additional initiatives set out above (noting that these additional initiatives are unbudgeted and would require an additional allocation of staff resourcing).

#### **RECOMMENDATION 1**

# Option 1 – Fly the Flag

"that Council, having considered Item L.1 – Request to Fly the Rainbow Flag, dated 24 July 2023, receives and notes the report and in doing so instructs the Chief Executive Officer to fly the rainbow flag on the flag pole at East Reserve, Mallala during business hours for the month of November 2023, and acknowledges that Adelaide Plains Council will be listed as a supporter in the Feast Program Guide and on the Feast website."

#### OR

Option 2 – Fly the Flag, Host a Community Event and Decorate the Office

"that Council, having considered Item 0.0 – Request to Fly the Rainbow Flag, dated 24 July 2023, receives and notes the report and in doing so instructs the Chief Executive Officer to:

1. Fly the rainbow flag on the flag pole at East Reserve, Mallala during business hours for the month of November 2023

- 2. Coordinate a community event to take place upon raising the flag on Monday 1 November 2023 and
- 3. Order marketing material to display at Council's Mallala Principal Office and Two Wells Service Centre throughout November 2023

and acknowledges that Adelaide Plains Council will be listed as a supporter in the Feast Program Guide and on the Feast website."

# **OR**

## Option 3 - Do Not Participate

"that Council, having considered Item 0.0 – Request to Fly the Rainbow Flag dated 24 July 2023, receives and notes the report and in doing so instructs the Chief Executive Officer to respond to Feast Festival advising that Adelaide Plains Council will not be participating in the initiative to fly the rainbow flag."

Members may recall that the rainbow flag was the subject of explicit vandalism in 2020. A replacement flag was immediately arranged, and raised and lowered daily, for the remainder of 2020. While the vandalism was extremely disappointing, the cost of replacing the flag and labour associated with raising and lowering daily, was minimal and, therefore, the risk of this occurring again need not deter Members from resolving that Council participate in the Feast Festival initiative should this otherwise be the wish of the Chamber.

#### **DETAILED REPORT**

# **Purpose**

The purpose of this report is for Council to consider Feast Festival's request (**Attachment 1**) to fly the rainbow flag for the month of November to recognise 'Pridevember'. Council may also wish to consider coordinating a community event to take place upon raising the flag on Monday 1 November 2023 and/or order marketing material to display at the Mallala Principal Office and Two Wells Service Centre.

## **Background**

'Feast' is Adelaide's Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Intersex and Questioning (LGBTIQ+) Queer Arts and Cultural Festival.

'Pridevember' is a month-long celebration of inclusivity and diversity in South Australia. Participating councils will be added to the Feast Festival 'roll call' in the 2023 Feast Program Guide.

Adelaide Plains Council first resolved to fly the rainbow flag in 2015, and the rainbow flag was displayed at the administration building during the 2015 Feast Festival.

Council has supported the initiative consistently since 2018-2022 by flying the rainbow flag in East Reserve adjacent to the Mallala Museum.

#### Discussion

It is for Council to consider and determine whether it wishes to again fly the rainbow flag in 2023 (if so, it is recommended that the flag be flown at East Reserve, Mallala during business hours) and whether it wishes to participate in either of the additional initiatives set out above (noting that these additional initiatives are unbudgeted and would require an additional allocation of staff resourcing).

If Council chooses to participate by flying the rainbow flag during the month of November administration will action accordingly.

Participating councils will be added to the festival roll call, appearing on a dedicated page in the 2023 Feast Program Guide which is distributed nationally in hard copy and is available for global access on the website.

Members may recall that the rainbow flag was the subject of explicit vandalism in 2020. A replacement flag was immediately arranged, and raised and lowered daily, for the remainder of 2020. While the vandalism was extremely disappointing, the cost of replacing the flag and labour associated with raising and lowering daily, was minimal and, therefore, the risk of this occurring again need not deter Members from resolving that Council participate in the Feast Festival initiative should this otherwise be the wish of the Chamber.

- Take a photo for social media and tag #FeastFestival and #SARainbowAdvocacyAlliance

Every year Feast invites the Mayor and CEO of each municipal council in South Australia to show their support or LGBTQIA+ people and their amilies living in their community by flying the rainbow flag for the duration of the Feast Festival, 5

This year Feast also invited numerous high schools from around South Australia to also ly the rainbow flag for an entire month to celebrate Feast's nitiative, "Pridevember" – celebrating everything Queer here in South Australia for the entire month of November.

Flying the rainbow flag actively contributes to the nealth and well-being of the whole community and s a symbolic way in which councils can help celebrate the Festival state-wide, as well as publicly acknowledging their councils role in promoting and elebrating diversity. This year we are pleased to announce that we have 24 municipal councils participating and 4 High Schools, some for various days during the estival, some for the duration of Feast and some for the entire month of November.

Whilst some municipalities have been prevented from displaying the flag on a flag pole, due to local Council policies, they overcame these obstacles by flying or hanging a rainbow flag in the windows of their community centre or library, or by erecting a temporary secondary flag pole for the duration of the Festival. Feast also asked many local businesses to fly/display the rainbow flag o celebrate 'Pridevember' with many joining the celebrations
