- In addition, the Adelaide Plains Council offers two additional awards:
 - Community Group of the Year, awarded to the group who have made a significant or beneficial contribution to the APC area and/or the community during the past year; and
 - Community Project of the Year, awarded for projects held entirely or predominantly in the APC region in the past year and organised with the assistance of one or more community groups/members.
- This year nominations have been received for the first four of the five awards on offer.

Awarded to the most outstanding Young Citizen for the Adelaide Plains Council region

Community Event of the Year

Awarded to the person or group who has staged the most outstanding community event during the past year in the Adelaide Plains Council region

In addition, the Adelaide Plains Council offers two additional awards:-

Adelaide Plains Council Award Categories

Community Group of the Year

Awarded to the group who have made a significant or beneficial contribution to the Adelaide Plains Council area and/or the community during the past year

Community Project of the Year

Awarded for projects held entirely or predominantly in the Adelaide Plains Council region in the past year and organised with the assistance of one or more community groups/members

Council has received three (3) nominations for the Citizen of the Year Awards, one (1) nomination for Young Citizen of the Year, one (1) nomination for Community Event of the Year, two (2) nominations for Community Group of the Year and nil nominations for Community Project of the Year.

According to the Australia Day Council – Australia Day Citizen of the Year Awards - Guidance and Criteria for Local Government authorities, all nominations submitted to Council must meet the

eligibility criteria. In the case that the criteria is not met, Council is not obligated to allocate an award in any of the five categories.

The number of nominations received for each category should bear no weight in their selection.

 - Glenys, as President of Salisbury and Northern Districts Club in 2015 was instrumental in organising the extremely successful Australian Friendship Force Conference (which was based at Mawson Lakes complex – food was bought from the local Two Wells Bakery for lunches).
 - Home hosts incoming overseas/interstate Friendship Force ambassadors and transports them around to showcase local heritage, businesses and items of interest
- Committee member of Two Wells Probus Club for many years
- Currently arranges Guest Speakers for Two Wells Probus Club
- Current President of Two Wells Probus Club.

At this year's Royal Adelaide Show Phoebe completed a 'clean sweep' exhibiting 8 animals who were all placed first in their classes and then went onto win 8 out of the 10 available Championships. A 2 year old Bull that Phoebe has bred went on to win the Reserve Champion Interbreed Bull of the Show. These achievements were crowned by Phoebe becoming one of the youngest ever exhibitors to take out the most successful Exhibitor in the Beef section at the Royal Adelaide Show.

One of the judges described Phoebe's cattle as "modern cattle meeting the demands of the industry and the consumer. He said the cattle were beautifully prepared and presented."

Phoebe successfully exhibited at the Royal Melbourne Show bringing home to the Adelaide Plains the Senior Champion Cow and Junior Reserve Champion Bull broad ribbons.

Young Limo breeder takes all

**MOST SUCCESSFUL
BEEF CATTLE
EXHIBITOR**

THE Royal Adelaide Show beef shed is full of exhibitors with decades of cattle breeding experience, but last week a newcomer trumped them all to win *Stock Journal's* trophy for most successful beef cattle exhibitor.

Eighteen-year-old Limousin breeder Phoebe Eckermann from Korunye, near Two Wells, took out the top prize after scooping the pool in the Limousin judging, winning blue ribbons with all eight head in their show team.

The junior, senior and grand champion female and junior, senior and grand champion bull ribbons were hanging above the cattle in the stalls.

Remarkably, Aruma Limousins - which Ms Eckermann runs with her father Peter - was established only five years ago and has just 11 head.

"It is a dream come true, I never expected going into this to do this," she said.

"We thought we had the stock this year so we thought we would bring them and give it a crack - every year it seems to get bigger," Ms Eckermann said.

Aruma Limousins' success continued in the led steer competition, with a steer they bred part of the champion team.

The steer, which was prepared by the Bruggemann family, Glental Partnership, Mallala, was the winner of the 620 kilogram to 788kg class and reserve champion export steer on-hoof.

Ms Eckermann's interest in breeding and showing cattle stemmed from attending the SA Junior Heifer Expo. She says her "passion has grown from there".

"I've always loved how you can create a bond with the animal and how it (showing) also brings our family together," she said.

Mr Eckermann says their decision to breed Limousins came by chance, but they have since found the breed's carcase traits are unrivalled and they are easy doing with a docile temperament.

"We didn't pick Limou-

sins - the breed picked us with Phoebe connected to a mentor associated with Limousins to help find her a heifer," he said.

"The established breeders have been really helpful and really encouraging."

Aruma's foundation females were two cows bought from the Galpin family's Warrawindi stud at Penola and they have since added bloodlines from Qld stud Oakwood.

The most successful beef cattle exhibitor award continues a golden run for Ms Eckermann, who was the non-herdsman winner at the recent SA Junior Heifer Expo in July.

She has also just been named the 2018-19 Limousin Youth ambassador.

Ms Eckermann, who is in her first year studying a Bachelor of Agriculture through the University of Adelaide, is keen to develop her stud futher.

"I am also really interested in agriculture and young people and the connection between city and country, so would really love to be an ag teacher one day," she said.
