Looking to the future for Thompson Beach, and Parham and Webb Beach

Adelaide Plains Council is working with locals to plan for the future of Thompson Beach, and Parham and Webb Beach. As the Adelaide Plains grows, planning is needed to foster liveable and sustainable outcomes across its coastal settlements.

Plans for the future of Thompson Beach, and Parham and Webb Beach will look at lifestyle, business, tourism and the environment. Council is creating these with the community and working towards supporting local facilities and services that are reasonably convenient and accessible, maintaining the region's enviable lifestyle.

A Discussion Paper is available on Council's website that details proposals for each area. These proposals have been informed by existing community feedback and relevant economic, social and environmental factors. Feedback is being sought from residents on the proposals and Council invites the community to put forward any ideas of their own to ensure the draft plans reflect the community's aspirations for the future.

Working with each settlement, the plans will identify actions that Council can deliver, lead or advocate for to boost the liveability and sustainability for both residents and visitors. Having a plan provides Council and the community clarity about the future of each area and informing Council's annual business planning, advocacy and other initiatives.
